Emergency calls are answered immediately; call office for Holy Communion or Anointing of the Sick.



Already here on earth the Christian life shares by faith in the blessed company of angels and men united in God.

The Epiphany of the Lord

This Sunday together with the church we continue to ponder the mysteries of the incarnation. December 25th we considered the birth of Jesus and His coming in the context of the history of people of Israel. This Sunday through the figures of the Wise Men we consider the revelation of Jesus to the Gentiles. The Wise Men were not Jews. They were probably well versed in wise sayings in different regions as well as natural sciences. The Wise men are a reminder to us that God comes for all peoples. They also remind us that the activities of God are observable, as the Wise Men are made aware of the birth of Jesus through an extraordinary natural phenomenon.

The name of the feast "Epiphany" comes from Greek, and it signifies the manifestation of Jesus to the earth. We celebrate that the 'light' of Jesus manifestation is also discernible to the Gentiles. They demonstrate a kind of faith. Each Magi begins for different reasons. Perhaps some want to observe the 'star' which has appeared. Others may want to question all who know anything about it. Regardless of their motives, they are transformed through their journey by a manifestation of God.

When the Magi came to the palace of Herod, they inquire about the birth of a new king. Ironically, the Magi seem to be more well informed than the people in the court of Herod, save that they have the scriptures which indicate where Jesus is to be born. This already is a manifestation of God. Our ability to reason is a God-given gift which should be used. Reason can illuminate many things about God. However, it does have limits. Some things require revelation for us to comprehend. Perhaps if the Magi were to come in our days, they might scoff at the idea of scripture. They might proudly cling on to their reason, which failed them to find Bethlehem, instead of hearing God's word. The Magi, however, do not ignore God's word. They humble themselves to receive God's revelation and because of this are able to behold Jesus.

Divine faith illuminates many things. Faith illuminated the way for the Magi from the palace of Herod to Bethlehem. It also illuminates to them the intentions of Herod who intended to kill the child, Jesus, when they are warned in a dream. Herod closed his ears to God. Without Faith, Herod perceives Jesus as a threat rather than a savior. The Magi are able to see the child Jesus because of their newfound faith. They are warned in a dream not to return to Herod, and they return home by another way.

I think that we can learn from the Magi. The Magi begin their journey to go through the use of natural reason. God does not shy away from using the things in the world to lead us to Himself. However, at some point more is required to continue the journey. It is as if God says to us, "Do you trust me?" "Then follow this way." The Magi followed, they encountered the Son of God and transformed they left for home by a 'different way.' May we also encounter God and be so transformed as to return home by a different way.

This week (January 8) we celebrate the Solemnity of Our Lady of Prompt Succor, Patroness of Louisiana. I will leave you with the following prayer to Our Lady of Prompt Succor.
